PRESCRIPTION DRUG TAKE BACK PROGRAM

Area Cities and their respective law enforcement agencies within the Rockwood School District will provide a “Drug Take Back” program on February 20, 2010 and April 17, 2010. The City of Wildwood, the City of Clarkson Valley, the City of Ellisville, the City of Ballwin and the City of Eureka, in cooperation with the Rockwood Drug Free Coalition, will conduct the program on Saturday mornings between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 1:00 P.M.

The purpose of this program is to increase the awareness of prescription and over the counter drug abuse issues facing our area’s youth and to help eliminate prescription drugs that are no longer being used from homes. The medicine cabinet in the home is the most popular source of medications of abuse. This program will provide a place for residents to safely dispose of prescription drugs that are no longer needed. The Prescription Take Back events proved extremely successful in the City of Eureka in 2009 and it is hoped that expanding the event will prove equally successful.

Medications can be brought to any location and the only requirement is that they are in original containers. The prescriptions can be from anyone living in your household and you must bring identification to verify your address.
